## WE MARCH DEMANDING JUSTICE

**We march for Eudy, Zoliswa, Sizakele and Salome:**

black lesbians raped, tortured and murdered for their sexual orientation and social activism.

**We march for Buyisiwe\*:**

Gang-raped by 8 men in 2005. Her docket was lost. She was harassed, intimidated by the perpetrators and driven from her home, but she continues to demand justice.

**We march for Khwezi\*:**

forced back into exile after Jacob Zuma's acquittal on rape charges.

**We march for Christina & Hola:**

Gang-raped, tortured, stabbed, strangled and set on fire. No-one has been charged with their murders.

**We march** because there have been **NO** convictions in these cases.

**We march** for **ALL** women silenced by sexual violence.

**We march** for **Jenni & MaG:** Zimbabwe women human rights defenders who have been detained in Zimbabwe under appalling conditions for protesting against the delay in food aid delivery in Zimbabwe.

**We march** for **ALL** women who resist despite oppressive state sponsored violence.

**WE MARCH DEMANDING JUSTICE.**

We call on AWID activists to join us and **march** with CapeTown feminists and human rights defenders in solidarity with women who speak out.

**We will march** through the inner city of Cape Town, starting from the Speakers Corner, Heerengracht, at 13h00 (gathering from 12h30).

**We will march** to the Provincial legislature where we will present a memorandum to representatives of the SA Govt and relevant agencies. We will stop traffic and together we will shatter the silence around sexual violence.

# About the One in Nine Campaign



The One In Nine Campaign was established in February 2006 at the start of the rape trial of Jacob Zuma (the ANC President), to ensure the expression of solidarity with the women in that trial as well as other women who speak out about rape and sexual violence.

A South African Medical Research Council (MRC) study on sexual violence (2005) indicated that only one out of every nine rape survivors report the attack to the police.

This statistic prompted the name: "One in Nine". Furthermore, statistics indicate that of the cases that do reach the courts, less than 5 % of the rapists are convicted. This highlights the serious need for transformation of the institutional framework for responding to women who speak out.
